

## Polytech'Nice Sophia: the meeting for new technologies supporting Visually Impaired persons.

For the 8<sup>th</sup> year now, the Engineering School of University of Nice-Sophia Antipolis (France) opens its doors to public. Next **20 May** is the day for the now traditional meeting for Visually Impaired people and New Technologies, showing the technologies of information and communication suited to Visually Impaired public.

The day is first of all a privileged place to meet for visually impaired, enterprises, scientists and official organisations. The aim is to inform visually impaired upon progresses of new technologies and to allow them to express their real needs. This day is mainly composed of conferences, round tables, companies and societies workshops.

The main topic of this year is the access to reading: « LIRE, clef du sa-VOIR » (means READING is the key to KNOWING). During this day, the students of Polytech'Nice Sophia will show educational and recreative software of their own, dedicated to visually impaired children in co-operation with the "Castle school" and the Clément Ader Institute for sensory education in Nice. Each participant will receive a CD containing the DeViNT games.



This year, the DEVINT prize awarded to the best student work dedicated to visually impaired is sponsored by the Thalès company.
